

RST AID TRAINING

People at work can suffer injuries or fall ill at all times. It doesn't matter whether the injury or illness is caused by work, however, it is important to give them immediate attention and call an ambulance in serious cases.

Any business in the UK must meet the legislative requirements governing first aid within the workplace. As a business, you should make arrangements to ensure sufficient help and support is available.

- The Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981
- The Health and Safety (First-Aid) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1982
- The Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974
- RIDDOR Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations (current Regulations)
- The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999

Who needs First Aid?

Provision for first aid at the workplace must be available at all times regardless of the size of your business.

The minimum first-aid provision on any work site is:

- a suitably stocked first-aid kit; an appointed person to take charge of first-aid arrangements
- information for employees about first-aid arrangements.

The first-aid provision needed will depend on the circumstances of each workplace.

Suggested Numbers of First Aid Personnel

Low Hazard

- Fewer than 25 employees require 1 small workplace compliant first-aid kit and at least 1 Appointed Person.
- 25-30 employees require 1 medium workplace compliant first-aid kit and at least 1 EFAW trained first-aider.
- More than 50 employees require 1 large workplace compliant first-aid kit (per 100 people) and at least 1 FAW trained first-aider for every 100 employees.

High Hazard

- Fewer than 5 employees require 1 small workplace compliant first-aid kit and at least 1 Appointed Person.
- 2-25 employees require 1 medium workplace compliant first-aid kit and at least 1 EFAW trained first-aider.
- More than 50 employees require 1 large workplace compliant first-aid kit (per 100 people) and at least 1 FAW trained first-aider for every 50 employees.

FIRE SAFETY TRAINING

According to Section 2 Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, every business in the UK must ensure so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and welfare of all their employees at work.

Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 states the if you are an employer the owner, the landlord, an occupier, anyone else with control of the premises (e.g. a facilities manager, building manager, managing agent or risk assessor) than you are known as the 'responsible person' for fire safety in business or other non-domestic premises.

The Fire Safety Order also applies if you have paying guests, e.g. if you run a bed and breakfast, guesthouse or let a self-catering property.

What are the responsibilities of 'responsible person'?

As the responsible person you must:

- carry out a fire risk assessment of the premises and review it regularly
- tell staff or their representatives about the risks you've identified
- put in place, and maintain, appropriate fire safety measures
- plan for an emergency
- provide staff information, fire safety instruction and training.

What is considered Non-domestic premises?

Non-domestic premises are:

- all workplaces and commercial premises
- all premises the public have access to
- the common areas of multi-occupied residential buildings.

Fire safety training

You need to train new staff when they start work and tell all employees about any new fire risks.

Penalties

A 'responsible person' could be fined or go to prison if they do not follow fire safety regulations.

Minor penalties can be up to £5,000. Major penalties can have unlimited fines and up to 2 years in prison.


